Decision-making imminent for next steps in UvA-VU Information Science


On 1 February 2017 the executive boards of UvA and VU will reach an agreement on shared housing plans, affecting several disciplines of the Amsterdam science faculties. This includes the intended move of the Information Science groups of both faculties into the NU Building.

In several working groups students and staff are

preparing a proposed decision, working out the implications of the move for research, staff, facilities, teaching and governance. In February, the proposed decision will be submitted to the Faculty Student Council for consultation. The aim is to reach a final decision before 1 April.

Andy Pimentel, director of the Graduate School of

Informatics, is a proponent of the move to the NU Building: 'Ensuring teaching quality has our full attention. Moving in together gives us the opportunity to offer more courses and a wider variety of topics for thesis projects. The facilities in the NU Building will be optimally customised for education in the information sciences.'
